Bob Owens, WCHS swim coach and Rush-Henrietta Rotarian, presented our evening program on the Peace Corps. This year is Peace Corps' 50th anniversary ... My how time flies :-)

President John Kennedy, speaking to a group in October 1960, threw out the idea that became the Peace Corps. The Peace Corps was authorized by Congress September 22, 1961.

In June 1969, Bob entered a 15 month program. In September 1970 he went to Iquitos, Peru, and worked there as a PCV for three years. While there, he met and married his wife. Their twin daughters have also served in South American countries with the Peace Corps.

There are 8-10,000 PCvolunteers at any one time. Their goals are to help people help themselves, let 3rd world people know Americans are real people, and develop a corp of people with another language and cultural understanding.

Bob and his wife have founded two charity projects in Iquitos. One is an education program for 6-12 year olds, and the other provides tutoring, meal-a-day, and uniforms for children to attend school. All donations go directly to the projects. There are no paid workers and the only overhead is a money transfer fee of approximately \$40. Donations are graciously accepted.

An informative and interesting program and we all learned a little more about the Peace Corps.

A **Board meeting** immediately followed our regular meeting.

Dave McGaffick reported on the Cub Cadet tractor rebuild. He attended the Alba Plow Days last Saturday and Sunday and sold \$150 worth of tickets. Lee Loomis volunteered to produce a spreadsheet and volunteer calendar for the project. Dave is set through May but will need volunteers to take the tractor to various events throughout the summer and sell tickets. He explained that for anyone winning the raffle and not wanting the tractor, the option would be \$1,500 cash. So everyone should want to purchase tickets.
