Lee introduced our speaker for the evening: Dwight Harrienger of the Catalyst Foundation, founded in 1999, focusing on improving the lives of orphaned, abandoned, and homeless children in Vietnam. The foundation works toward a “positive change for the children of Vietnam.”

He, his wife, and two daughters will be among 81 people going to Vietnam this year to help set up medical clinics and build homes. His passion is the families living on a landfill (better defined as a garbage dump). The Vietnamese daughters are often stolen and sold into prostitution.

Some Rotary Firsts

- Rotary established the Rotary Endowment Fund in 1917, which became the forerunner of The Rotary Foundation.
- Rotary first established the Paul Harris Fellow Recognition in 1957 for contributors of \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation.
- The Rotary emblem was printed on a commemorative stamp for the first time in 1931 for the Vienna convention.
- The first Rotary club banner (from the Houston Space Center Rotary club) to orbit the moon was carried by astronaut club member Frank Borman on the Apollo 8 flight in 1968.
- The first Rotary Convention held outside the United states was in Edinburgh, Scotland, in 1921.
- The first head of state to address an RI Convention was U.S President Warren G. Harding in 1923 at St. Louis, Missouri.
