A committee was formed and included former Rotarian and Superintendent of Wheatland-Chili Central School District Chris Manasari, former Rotarian Rich Jasinski, honorary Rotarian Elizabeth Murray, Glenn Balch and Diana Balch, along with many other community members. This year the Landmark Society toured the Sage-Marlowe House and the WC historical schoolhouse and included them in their prestigious awards. It was an interesting afternoon and an honor for our community to receive these awards.

The program began in February and is currently serving 10-12 individuals and/or families. Meal Bags consist of food to provide one complete, well balanced meal plus some extras. If there is more than one child in the household the family receives two bags. Flyers are located in the laundromat, the library, and the Village/Town office. Buster's has joined the program providing recently expired food items. Grace's Table is open on Thursdays from 4:30 to 6:00PM. Not necessary to sign up ahead of time, just show up during this time period to receive a Meal Bag. It is a wonderful local program and Scottsville Rotary is excited to help by providing food and household supplies.
