October 11, 2011

This was our third and final road clean-up for the year. Following the road clean-up, the club met at the Scottsville Diner to discuss the future of Camp Haccamo. Lee Loomis chaired this portion of our meeting to report on the situation and request from RCSN (Rotary Camps for Children with Special Needs).

The situation the Camp is in is to find replacement funding to replace the LPGA funds that previously were designated to the camps. The two fundraising activities are the Hike for Haccamo and ROC City Uncorked. The hope is for ROC City Uncorked to grow to the point that it becomes the primary replacement. At this point, we have a long way to go. ROC City Uncorked took in \$107,000 in 2010. In 2011, the revenue had fallen to \$80,000.

The RCSN is proposing the following:
Looking for a commitment from each club in Monroe County on ticket sales and sponsorship identification. We do not have to approach the potential sponsor or advertiser, but instead identify them to RCSN and they will have a team approach them. The commitment they are asking for is ticket sales of two times our club membership and \$80 per member in sponsor/advertiser identification. After considerable discussion, the club voted to give RCSN our commitment to this proposal.

Also discussed was dictionary order for the third graders of TJ Connor as well as home-school students in WCCSD. We also provide dictionaries for the third graders at School # 34.
